



"MEMORIES OF THE FUTURE" Reception at MU Gallery SEPT. 19TH, 5-7PM TALKS@5:30P

"Memories Of Our Future " examines how curation can challenge a sanitized version of history while bringing attention to marginalized groups. The exhibition is curated by Ren Dillard of Atlanta, GA and it uses the permanent collections of North Dakota State University's to challenge traditional narratives often reinforced by museums and institutions. Through texts, recordings, everyday objects and artwork sequestered to the storage of a vault, Dillard has curated an installation that draws attention to the complex histories of blacks and Native Americans, in affront to familiar historical narratives.

Dillard will be visiting North Dakota State University from September 16-20 and will speaking about his curation during a reception on September 19th from 5-7pm. This exhibition will be on display from September 19- October 12.


