








NDSU PROFESSOR'S SESSION PROPOSAL Accepted to art conference

ARCH 789 PRESERVATION SEMINAR ADVENTURE

On September 20-22, 16 Architecture Students and one Landscape Architecture student embarked on an adventure off the beaten path in southwestern North Dakota.


The ARCH 789 Historic Preservation seminar, taught by Professor Heather Fischer, provides students with an opportunity to create field measured drawings from existing Germans from Russia vernacular homesteads.

The first day started with a trip to the Schmidt home south of New Leipzig, ND followed by the Beisigl Ranch just north of Lemmon, SD. Students stopped at

Kevin Carvell's home in Mott, ND, for a tour of his private library, which contains over 13,000 related to North Dakota. The next stop was the Lampl homestead just south of Regent, ND and finally a tour of Assumption Abbey in Richardton, ND.

The exhibition stems from a long running thesis by NDSU professor, School of Design, Architecture, and Art Director, and ceramic artist Michael Strand, who argues ceramic artists have a proclivity for working with communities to help create positive change.

His belief is that the relationships and skills required to be a ceramic artists can function as a scaffold for other community-based projects. Each artist and organization featured in this exhibition has a different approach, using their time, knowledge, art, or ideas to listen and create change in the world. Featuring work from artists Julia Galloway, Cannupa Hanska Luger, Eddie Dominguez, Steve Hilton, Paul Wong, Amber Ginsberg, Fargo Public School students, and more, this exhibition will bring you on a path of love and hard work to help you see that the practice really is, in fact, the point.






TRI-COLLEGE UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY YOUTH ACTIVITY AND COLORING BOOKS
