

Regin is now an iceboat skipper!

Associate Prof. officially became an Iceboat skipper of Yankee D-181 when he took a solo ride in December on Lake Christina in Minnesota.

An iceboat is an object that manifest a tangible and visible form of wind, water, horizon, movement, and time. A perfect frozen lake is needed to use an iceboat and there cannot be too much or too little wind when sailing.

An iceboat is a beautiful combination of engineering and architecture similar to great objects and shapes such as the Sidney Opera Building, the Golden Gate Bridge, the Concorde, the Formula One car, or a knife that fits perfectly when held. An iceboat is equipped with 3 large razor-sharp stainless-steel runners and an extraordinary sense of timing is needed to use such vehicle.

Always have experts investigate any lake before you go out on the ice and bring a PFD and a helmet.
