JIM FALCK WORK IN BISMARCK

Jim Falck's work is currently touring North Dakota for an exhibition titled "A Protest Against Forgetting." The Falck Collection comprises over 1,600 works of art created by the artist, architect Jim Falck over a period of 60 years, beginning in the mid-1950s until the 2010s. They were donated to NDSU by the Jim Falck Estate at the time of his death in 2013, and are owned by the NDSU Development Foundation and housed and managed by the Memorial Union Gallery.

The works are beginning their tour at Bismark State College where they will be on display for the month. The majority of these pieces are paintings done in acrylic on paper and range in subject matter from landscapes to still-lifes to portraits. There are also a number of works on canvas, as well as nearly 120 ceramic sculptures. Falck created work that was primarily influenced by the master artists of the early and mid-twentieth century. References to Pablo Picasso, Henri Matisse, Joan Miro, and Clyfford Still can be frequently spotted in Falck's images.

Reanna Lardy—

Throughout my trip, I explored different aspects of homelessness throughout Boston, New York, and Philadelphia. This experience has opened my eyes in many directions and offered a more extensive view of homelessness by seeing this issue first hand. Taking my viewpoint before traveling and challenging the stereotypes of homelessness, I am presenting my findings and addressing different perceptions of these three major East Coast cities.

Jared Kaesmeyer—

After World War 2, the United States began to achieve seemingly boundless ascendancy in architecture. Modernists like Walter Gropious, Marcel Breuer, Mies Van Der Rohe, Eero Saarinen, I.M. Pei, and Louis Kahn fled the war torn Europe and settled on their closest shore, the East Coast of America. There, these starchitects would go on to shape our modernist built environment for almost 40 years. Despite so much success, clearly many of these designs didn't work at times. If they did, wouldn't we see more concrete clad high schools? More glass-walled homes? In all the variety, typology, client, and architect types of the East Coast Mid-Century Modern Movement, what work persevered till today, and what failed?



The Fargo-Moorhead, ND Chapter #246 of the National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) is sponsoring the NAWIC Education Foundation's (NEF) Design Drafting Competition for the 2020-2021 school year. The contest provides recognition to contestants for their creative design, successful problem-solving skills, and craftsmanship in preparing architectural drawings and renderings. The drawings may be created utilizing any computer aided design (CAD) program available to the contestants, drawn by hand, or may consist of a combination of computer aided and hand drawn drawings. The winner of the local competition will go on to compete in the Regional Competition and the Regional winner will be submitted to compete in NEF's National Competition.
