## A PHOTOGRAPHIC JOURNEY: THE LIFE AND WORK OF LEO KIM

A Photographic Journey is an exploration of the work and life of distinguished photographer and former NDSU student, Leo Kim. A reception will be held on October 13th from 5-7pm at the Memorial Union Gallery. The event is free and open to the public.

Kim published two books, "North Dakota: Prairie Landscape" and "Saint Paul Serenity", that include photographs of the undeniable beauty of the peaceful prairie and the calmness that can be found in a bustling diverse city. Some of these photographs can be found in this exhibit. Kim also generously shared his artistic gifts by mentoring aspiring photographers. The donation of his work to the NDSU Archives adds his important legacy to their strong photojournalism collection.



## A QUIET VOICE HEARD: HOMECOMING RETROSPECTIVE OF KENT KAPPLINGER OCTOBER 6TH - NOVEMBER 6TH

In this exhibition, the artist addresses social and environmental concerns viewed through his rural-based background. The work considers one's place and purpose in the communities we call home. Though the imagery highlights existing tensions, it ultimately seeks a harmonious relationship between humans, nature, and constructed environments.

Kent Kapplinger '77 is an emeritus professor of visual arts at North Dakota State University where he has taught printmaking, drawing, and foundations for nearly 30 years. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in art from Augustana University and Master of Fine Arts degree from the University of Iowa in 1992.

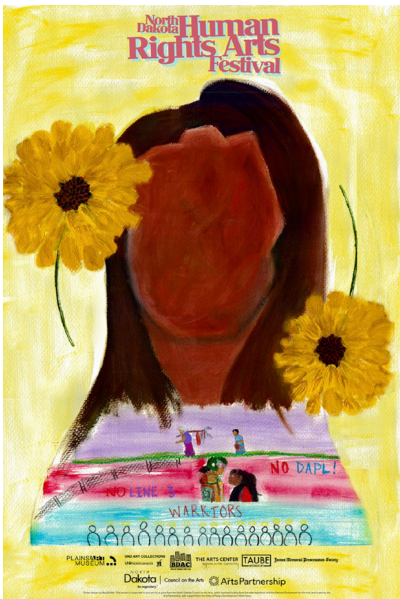
