NDSU STUDENT EXHIBITION OCTOBER 1 - NOVEMBER 19

The goal of this internship is to expand your experience in the arts. When you finish this internship we would like you to have an understanding of how to curate works of art, know how to handle professional works of art, be able to articulate and share your thoughts, and grow an appreciation for the effort it takes to curate a gallery show.

This internship will take place in the Memorial Union Art Gallery at NDSU. This two day internship opportunity will take place on Friday from 2:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. It will take place three different times throughout the school year on Oct. 14th-15th, Dec. 2nd-3rd, and Jan 20th - 21st. If selected, you will only intern for one weekend, and 1-2 students will be chosen per weekend.

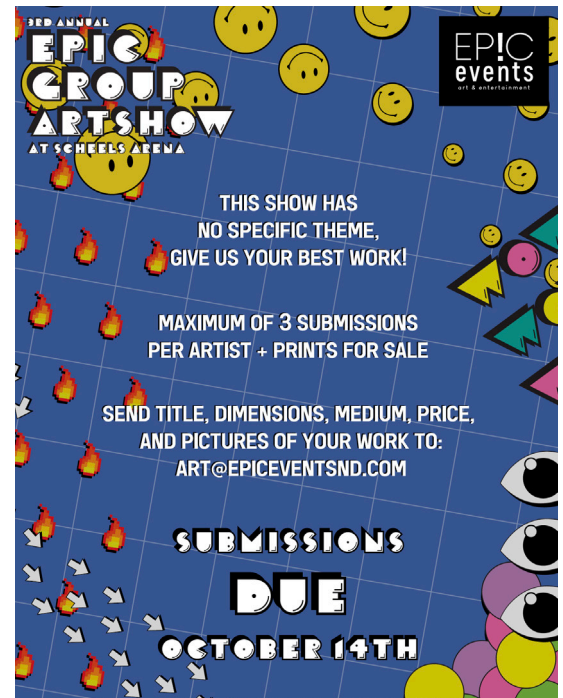
