ANDREW STARK PAINTING INSTALLED AT THE LANDING

Assistant Professor of Practice Andrew Stark installed a 7' x 10' oil painting titled "Coalescence" in the entrance of a newly completed Kilbourne Group project in Fargo.


The Landing is a \$30 million mixed-use development at 1001 Northern Pacific Avenue in downtown Fargo that broke ground October 2020 and officially began welcoming residents to their new homes in August 2022. The name is a nod to the site's historical roots as a planing mill served by a Northern Pacific rail spur. The project is designed to create a strong welcome to Fargo's walkable downtown as visitors enter from the 10th Street underpass. Stark began in the summer of 2021 and painted for over a year on the large scale work.


