

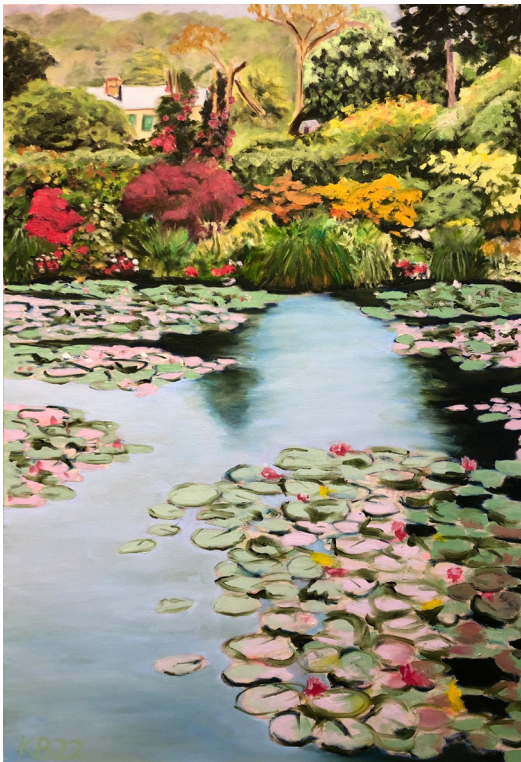
Join the NDSU Chapter of the United States Building Council on September 28th to enjoy some food, play yard games, and learn more about USGBC!

NDSU RESEARCH FOUNDATION FILES U.S. PATENT BASED ON RESEARCH DONE BY ARCHITECTURE FACULTY MEMBER

Dr. Ganapathy Mahalingam, Professor of Architecture, worked this past summer with student researcher, Claire Olson, on the project, Calibrating the Built Environment Using Biosensing Equipment. The project was used to generate intellectual property about calibrating buildings for their affordance of physical activity and wellness. A provisional US patent was filed for the methodology developed, by the NDSU Research Foundation. The summer project was funded by an Undergraduate Biomedical Research Award from the Office of Research and Creative Activity at NDSU. This is the first ever patent filed by the NDSU Research Foundation based on the research of a faculty member of the Architecture program at NDSU.



PROFESSOR KIMBLE BROMLEY'S WORK TO BE FEATURED

Kim Bromley's work will be featured at the Dahl Art Center in Rapid City, SD September 16 – January 20th. Each summer, Kimble sets up an outdoor studio for plein air painting by his pond near Pelican Rapids, MN. Color Around the Pond takes inspiration from his own eight-acre pond in MN as well as a 2019 trip he took to Claude Monet's home and gardens in Giverny, France. "I wanted to look at how he paints...Seeing his gardens, I can see where he got his inspiration." Paintings will be exhibited in the Sen. Stan Adelstein & Lynda K. Clark Gallery. There will be a closing reception January 20 from 5:00-7:00 pm with an artist's talk at 5:45.

Kim also has two works hanging at the Plains Art Museum. One piece is exhibited in the FMVA Studio Crawl Preview Exhibition running from September 3 – November 26, 2022. Each year, Fargo Moorhead Visual Artists (FMVA) presents the Studio Crawl – a popular, free event that gives the community access to professional artist studios. The Studio Crawl is an opportunity for people to meet artists, see demonstrations and purchase work. The second piece Kim has exhibiting is part of the 2022-23 FMVA Constraint Exhibition which runs from September 24th, 2022 – January 14th 2023. The theme of this year's exhibition is, "encounters/spirituality with nature."

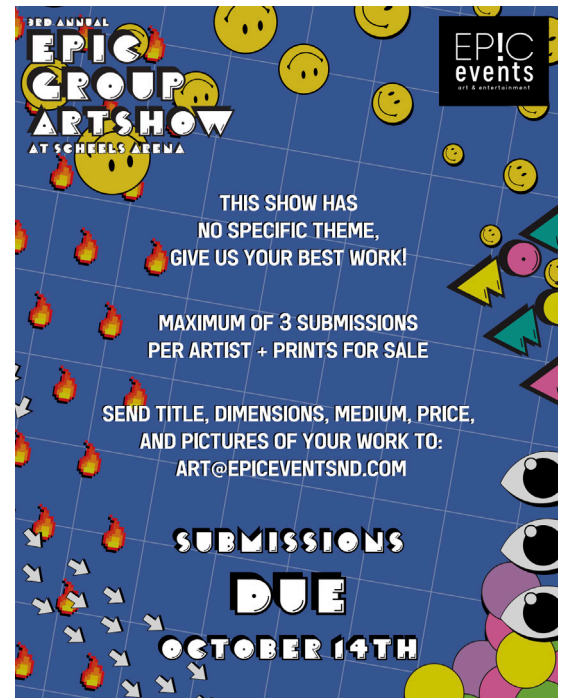
